

Camden County College GED Pre-registration, Payment and Scheduling Information

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Welcome to Camden County College GED testing! Before testing all candidates must pre-register, pay and schedule a test. Please follow the steps listed below:

Step # 1 Pre-Register:

- A) All prospective GED candidates must pre-register online at www.GED123.org
- B) Each candidate must print a **confirmation page** from GED 123 and bring the confirmation when paying and scheduling their test.

Step #2 Paying and Scheduling for the Test:

Paying and scheduling the test must be done at the same time.

- A) Candidates must bring in the pre-registration confirmation page from GED 123.
- B) Each candidate must bring two current forms of identification.
- C) Only money orders made out to Camden County College will be accepted.

GED Testing Fees:

Full Battery of Tests: \$50 non-refundable fee

Re-Examination Fee: \$10 per test non-refundable fee

No cash, checks or credit cards will be accepted. Only money orders made out to Camden County College will be accepted.

Required Photo Identification (No Exceptions):

All GED candidates must have two forms of ID when scheduling the test.

- A) The first ID must be a current photo ID such as Current Driver's License, Current Passport, Current State Issued Identification.
- B) The secondary ID should be an official social security card.

On the test day, no one will be admitted into the test without a photo ID.

Eligibility for the Test:

The candidate must be a New Jersey resident. Candidates who are 16 or 17 years of age must have a signed parental consent. The "Certificate of Consent to participate" is available at the Testing Center.

Cancellations: Candidates who fail to show for the test and do not notify the testing facility at least 72 hours in advance of the scheduled test date will be required to pay the entire fee again. Seating is limited, and failure to notify a test cancellation in a timely manner creates a lost testing opportunity for others.

Test Day: On the day of the test, candidates must report to the **Camden Technology Center, Camden City Campus, Room 203 by 12:15pm**. Without exception, **no** late arrivals will be admitted since it causes a disturbance to other test takers.

The Test: The test is 7 hours and 25 minutes long and is administered over a two day period on a Wednesday and Thursday twice a month beginning at 12:15pm. **No walk-ins are allowed on the test date**. A test date will be arranged with the GED Examiner during Step #2, paying and scheduling a test date.

Test Center Policies: All candidates will be given written information about test center policies at the time of payment and scheduling. All policies will be strictly adhered to in order to ensure a positive and professional testing experience for everyone.

Test Schedule: The test is given two times a month. Seats are filled on a first come first served basis. After payment is received, candidates will be scheduled for the first convenient time that is available.

Test Preparation: The Adult Basic Skills Program at CCC offers both morning and afternoon sessions. For information about registering for this program, please call (856) 968-1315.

The Gateway Program at CCC offers a 14 week session for basic skills/GED preparation classes. Classes are held at various locations in Camden City. There is a \$25 registration fee. For more information, please call the Gateway Coordinator at (856) 968-1210.

Special Accommodations: Special accommodations may be granted to candidates after the required documentation has been submitted by the candidate and reviewed by the NJ State Administrator.

Passing Score: In order to pass the test, the GED candidate must have a total passing score of 2250. Each single test must have a minimum score of 410. The minimum average for each test is 450.
