



Dear Student:

Thank you for registering early for the spring 2010 semester at Camden County College! The 15-week semester begins on Wednesday January 20, 2010. We hope this semester brings a wealth of knowledge and success in your academic endeavors. This letter provides important information about your eligibility to use your financial aid to purchase books.

As a result of your early registration the financial aid office is able to advance a portion of your approved spring semester financial aid (grants, scholarships, and loans) to you to assist you with the purchase of your books and supplies. For the spring 2010 semester the College is continuing the process implemented for the fall 2008 semester whereby you will be able to purchase your books and supplies at any campus bookstore (Blackwood, Camden or Cherry Hill).

Information about your eligibility to purchase books has been forwarded to the campus bookstores. You may purchase your books and supplies for the spring 2010 semester beginning on **Monday January 4, 2010** by presenting your current, validated CCC student identification card at the bookstore. Your purchasing privileges expire on March 1, 2010. Any funds that you have not spent will be refunded to you in your stipend check. Please read the bookstore purchasing FAQ for additional information. The FAQ is available on the College's web site in the financial aid forms library.

The College will begin to mail spring semester stipend checks to eligible students at the end of March 2010. In order to maintain eligibility for your financial aid (including grants, scholarships, loans, tuition waivers, and work-study), you are required to remain enrolled in and to continue to attend your classes. If you never attend, cease to attend, withdraw, or receive "F's", "W, s", "NA's", or "XA's", you will jeopardize your financial aid for both current and future semesters. If you fail to remain enrolled in and to attend at least one course until the end of the semester, the College is required to reduce or cancel your financial aid and to retroactively remove it from your account. If you are eligible for a loan you must continue to attend at 6 credits of classes or your loan will be cancelled (and returned to your lender, if applicable).

If your financial aid is reduced or cancelled you will remain personally responsible to pay for all outstanding tuition, fees, book and stipend amounts that you incur at CCC. For more information about how your attendance impacts your financial aid eligibility please read the Satisfactory Academic Progress policy in the *Financial Aid Handbook* (pages 70-73). The *Handbook* is available in the financial aid office and on the College's website at www.camdencc.edu.

We hope you enjoy the convenience of the interim book purchasing process. The staff of the Office of Financial Aid extends its best wishes to you for a successful semester.
