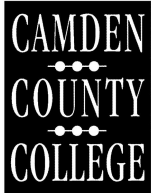
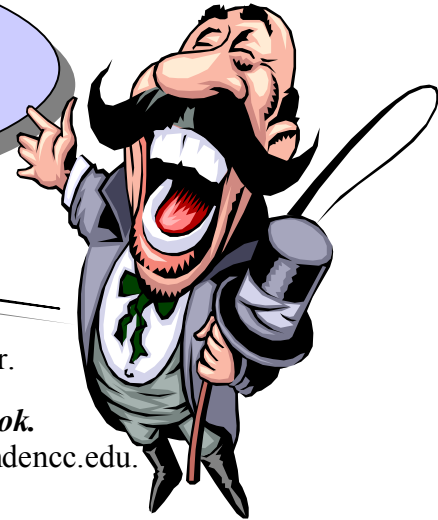


FAQ

Summer Financial Aid



This FAQ was prepared by the Office of Financial Aid to answer questions about aid eligibility for summer.

For expanded information please read the *Financial Aid Handbook*. The Handbook is available on the College's web site at www.camdencc.edu.

Stop waiting in line – Get on-line!

Approximately two weeks after you have taken the placement test and been accepted to CCC, you will be able to check your status on the College's web site at www.camdencc.edu. By using WebAdvisor* you can register for classes, pay your bill, check your account status, check your financial aid eligibility, view the forms needed to complete your financial aid file, view your grades and manage many other aspects of your enrollment.

At CCC the summer semester is considered to be part of the preceding academic year.

For summer 2009 you must file the **2008-2009** Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)*, which is based upon your 2007 income.

For the **2009-2010** year (fall 2009, spring 2010 and summer 2010), you will need your 2008 income.

If you are planning to enroll for the summer 2009 and fall 2009 semesters you must submit both the 2008-2009 and 2009-2010 FAFSAs.

Apply as soon as possible by submitting your FAFSA on line at www.fafsa.ed.gov. We recommend that you file on line for the fastest processing. You should expect it to take approximately ten days for the College to receive your FAFSA after you submit it on line. The fafsa.ed.gov web site is free. **Never pay to file your FAFSA!**

Remember to select the 2008-2009 or 2009-2010 FAFSA as appropriate.

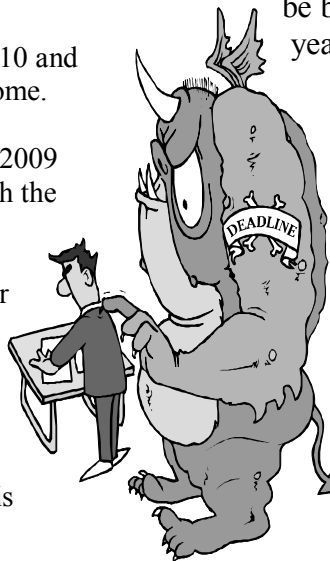
The College's preference deadline for submission of the FAFSA is **May 1**. Remember to apply by the deadline for each year of your enrollment.

You will need the College's federal school code for your FAFSA. The code is **006865**.

In addition to the FAFSA you must also submit the CCC Authorization form, which is available on line at www.camdencc.edu on the financial aid E-Forms page and in the financial aid office.

Summer financial aid is based upon any remaining eligibility from the previous academic year. Again, for the summer 2009 semester your eligibility for financial aid will be based upon the 2008-2009 academic year.

As a general guideline you may have remaining financial aid for summer if you enrolled on a part time basis during either the fall 2008 or spring 2009 semesters. Contact the financial aid office for additional information.



***Do not delay -
Apply today!***

Regrettably if we have not received your complete FAFSA information and all other required documents we cannot hold your registration. You must pay for your classes and be reimbursed should you qualify for financial aid.

Got aid? – Keep it!

Two of the most important factors in continuing your financial aid eligibility are your enrollment and your grades.

In order to continue your financial aid eligibility you must remain enrolled in your classes until the end of the semester.



You also must meet the financial aid academic progress standard*, in that you must earn good grades in most of your classes. Grades of “D”, “F”, “XA”, “NA”, “W”, “MP” and “RV” negatively impact your eligibility for financial aid.

Book Vouchers

You may be eligible for a book voucher* to pay for some or all of your books and supplies in the campus book stores.

In order for you to be eligible for a book voucher the total of your financial aid grants and loans must exceed the cost of your tuition and fees.



Your book voucher is **deducted** from your financial aid (grants and loans).

You must be registered and awarded before a book voucher account can be prepared for you. After you have registered and been awarded your book account is typically ready to use after two p.m. on the next business day.

You may begin to use your book account for the summer 2009 semester on Monday May 4.

Book accounts will be available for the fall and spring semesters under the same guidelines.

If you have a valid book voucher for the semester you may begin to use it in the book store to make purchases approximately two weeks before the semester begins. Book vouchers expire approximately six weeks after they are issued.



You are financially responsible for all charges on your account in the bookstores!

Stipend Checks

You may be eligible for a refund (stipend check)* from your financial aid if the total of your financial aid grants and loans exceeds the cost of your tuition, fees and books.

In order to be eligible for your stipend you must remain enrolled in your classes until the end of the semester.

Stipend checks will be mailed to eligible students in November for the fall semester, in April for the spring semester, and in July for the summer semester.

High School Students

As a graduating high-school senior you are unlikely to be eligible for financial aid during the summer of your graduation. In order to establish eligibility for financial aid the student must have graduated from high school, or earned a GED, prior to the start of the semester (May 18 for summer 2009).

Nursing Students

Students who are enrolled in the nursing schools may be eligible to borrow additional funds from the Stafford loan program for the summer. Your eligibility will depend upon the following factors:

1. your dependency status
2. your class level in the nursing program
3. the total amount that you previously borrowed during the 2008-2009 academic year
4. your enrollment during the summer semester (you must enroll for a minimum of 6 credits in order to be eligible for a Stafford loan)

2009 - 2010 Financial Aid

When we receive your FAFSA we will calculate your financial aid awards for both the fall 2009 and spring 2010 semesters. It is not necessary to reapply for financial aid for the spring semester.

You will however, need to reapply for financial aid for the fall 2010 spring 2011 semesters.

Summer 2010 Financial Aid

Remember, you may be eligible for financial aid for the summer semester if you received financial aid as a part time student during the fall or spring semester.

Ask an advisor in the financial aid office for additional information about summer eligibility.

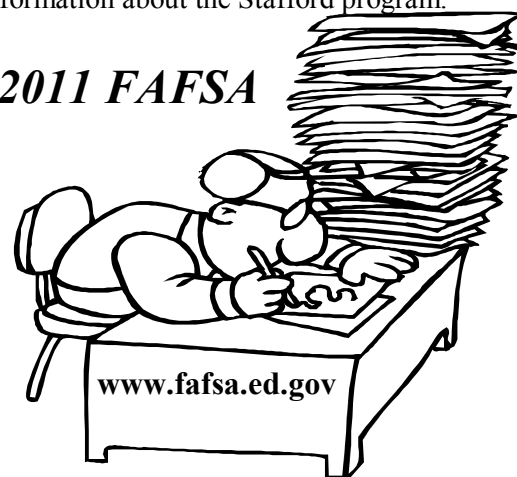


If you are interested in applying for a loan for the 2009-2010 academic year you must complete the following paperwork (at minimum):

- 1. A processed 2009-2010 FAFSA resulting in a complete needs analysis* report being released to CCC. You must indicate that you are interested in the loan program in question 26 on the FAFSA.
- 2. A completed Authorization and Certification form (submit once, during the first year of financial aid receipt).
- 3. A Stafford* entrance counseling* form (submit once at the beginning of the initial year of borrowing)
- 4. A Stafford Master Promissory Note (MPN*) (submit once at the beginning of the initial year of borrowing at CCC).
- 5. A Stafford exit counseling* form (submit once at graduation or cessation of at least one-half time enrollment)

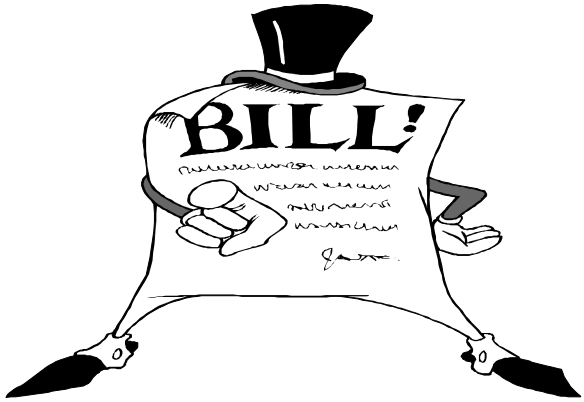

2010 – 2011 FAFSA



The time to apply for the 2010-2011 academic year will be here soon! File your 2010-2011 FAFSA as soon as possible after **January 1, 2010**.

Payment is due when you register !!!



If your FAFSA has been received by the College and you appear to be eligible for financial aid and we have all of the other information that we need from you we may be able to hold your classes.

If you have applied for financial aid and we hold your classes you are financially responsible for payment of all charges whether or not you attend classes, and whether or not you qualify for financial aid.

If you decide that you do not wish to attend CCC you must take action to drop your classes by applicable published deadlines!

Financial aid file completion check list

To complete your 2009-2010 financial aid file you must submit (at minimum):

- 1. A processed 2009-2010 FAFSA resulting in a complete needs analysis* report being released to CCC.
- 2. A completed Authorization and Certification form (submit once, during the first year of aid receipt).

If you are selected for verification or you are an initial applicant for EOF* you must also submit items number 3, 4, 5, and 6:

- 3. A completed verification* worksheet. (Obtain from the CCC web site or from the Office of Financial Aid.)
- 4. Photocopy of 2008 federal income tax return: Student and Parent return if Dependent*; Student (& spouse) return if Independent*.
- 5. Documentation of 2008 calendar year untaxed income (child support, untaxed pensions, workmen's compensation, disability, etc. Must be listed on the verification* worksheet).
- 6. Any other documentation requested by HESAA*, the EOF Office or the Office of Financial Aid
