

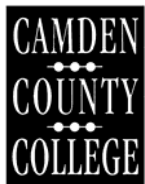
STUDENT CLUBS AND ORGANIZATIONS

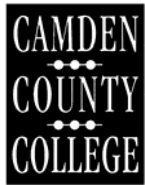
