

## Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) and American Rescue Plan (ARP) Reporting

On December 27, 2020, the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) was signed into law. This new law supplemented the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES), and authorized the U.S. Department of Education to distribute additional funds to institutions of higher education in order to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus through the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund. CRRSAA stipulated that a portion of the funds disbursed were to be used for emergency assistance grants directly to students. Also on March 11, 2020 the American Rescue Plan was signed into law and Camden County College has signed and returned agreements to participate in both acts.

## **Awarding parameters:**

Camden County College (CCC) used several parameters in awarding the CRSSA and ARP funds.

- All student who were enrolled in 2020-21 with Pell entitlement were automatically award \$750. This was to ensure that students that had demonstrated need were afforded an opportunity to receive the funds. Student for the Fall 2021 semester with Pell grant eligibility were awarded \$750 and all other students were awarded \$500.
- All international and DACA students were automatically awarded \$750; to receive this funding they did not need to complete an application or demonstrate a hardship.
- Students with balances were given the opportunity to apply to have those balances paid. They were required to complete a separate form granting CCC permission to apply the funds directly to their student account.
- Continuing Education made \$1000 awards available to their students based on an internal application process.
- All student were with an extraordinary circumstance was given the opportunity to complete an online application. If students had a completed FAFSA that showed remaining financial need they were automatically awarded. If they did not have remaining need they could provide an explanation of their hardship to obtain the funding. Students were typically awarded \$1000 if they were registered for more than 6 credits and \$500 for 1-5 credits.
