In this participatory workshop, attendees will discuss Response to Intervention (RTI) as a multi-tier approach to the early identification and support of students with learning and behavior needs. The RTI process begins with high-quality scientifically based instruction and universal screening of all children in the general education classroom. Participants will look at interventions provided to struggling learners at increasing levels of intensity to accelerate their rate of learning. The multi-tiered approach, used to efficiently differentiate instruction for all students, and how instructional interventions should be used to match identified deficits, will be discussed.

CHERYL TARTAGLIONE, is a Reading Specialist with a master's degree in reading. She is an Orton-Gillingham therapist who served for nine years as a practicum instructor for Fairleigh Dickinson University at the Children's Dyslexia Center in Northfield, NJ. A member of the International Dyslexia Association (IDA) and the International Multisensory Structured Language Education Council (IMSLEC), she is trained in several multisensory based reading programs including Wilson Language System, Language, Project Read (all strands) and LiPs. She is currently serving as a reading specialist and a response to intervention teacher for Glassboro Public Schools.

Addressing the needs of Transgender students is an emerging challenge and opportunity for schools. Rapid changes in social awareness and acceptance, recent legal developments, and students who are transitioning at younger ages or who are identifying “outside the binary” have created an urgent need for schools to educate K-12 students, staff, and parents about transgender issues. Uncertainty about the rights of transgender individuals at the federal level has led to confusion; therefore, it is important for all school staff to be aware of the rights of transgender students in New Jersey schools. Topics include: basic knowledge and understanding, including contemporary respectful terminology and pronouns; the difference between gender identity/expression and sexual orientation; dispelling stereotypes about transgender people; the social, legal, and medical aspects of the transition process; supporting transitioning students and managing difficult situations including parental non-acceptance; the rights of transgender students including gender-specific facilities and sports (e.g., NJ LAD, ABR, NJSIAA policy, NJ Chapter 137, upcoming DOE guidance); student confidentiality; transgender policy pitfalls and recommendations; strategies for creating a safe school climate for transgender students; classroom strategies; age-appropriate curricula, lesson plans, and educational resources; and strategies for educating parents.

She is working toward the goal of a society in which diversity is respected and celebrated, schools are safe for children, workplaces are free of harassment, and all individuals are fully included.





Can you build a brick home without mortar? What will hold the bricks together? All educators know the importance of vocabulary to comprehending text. Like mortar, vocabulary is the “glue” that enables students to understand what they are reading. Another major shift of the Common Core/New Jersey Student State Standards is Tier II vocabulary found in all content areas. This workshop will focus on Tier II and Tier III academic vocabulary of the standards and how it relates to the PARCC assessment. Emphasis on learning tiered vocabulary, strategies to incorporate vocabulary in all content areas, student self-assessment strategies, and the effectiveness of tiered academic vocabulary as it relates to the PARCC assessment will be addressed in this session.

Specific objectives for this workshop include:


