

Camden County College is not responsible for any applicant who does not follow the instructions in this application booklet. The applicant is solely responsible for completing the application fully and correctly. Failure to fully complete the application may result in an automatic rejection. If the applicant is not accepted, the applicant must reapply by submitting a new application. There is no waiting list.

Applicants to the program must fulfill all listed admission criteria. Camden County College Nursing admission is highly competitive. Applicants with the highest scores on the Camden County College nursing program admissions assessment form rubric will be considered for admission to the program. The Admissions rubric is based on a combination of TEAS tests scores, course grades, and other criteria. Please note that meeting all of the admission criteria does not guarantee acceptance into the program.

Admission requirements for the LPN to RN program are subject to change each year. All applicants who apply to the nursing program are required to meet all of the requirements of the application period for which they apply, including those who have previously applied to, or who are currently enrolled at Camden County College. Students will be notified via their Camden County College student email regarding admission status into the Camden County College program. Students must confirm acceptance into the LPN to RN program immediately upon receipt of the acceptance letter via Camden County College student email. Students will also be notified of a mandatory orientation date. Students who do not accept their seat within the time frame indicated on the acceptance letter, or do not attend the mandatory orientation risk losing their seat in the program.

If you are accepted into the program, it will be a conditional acceptance until the requirements outlined in your acceptance letter are completed. See PHASE II: CONDITIONAL ACCEPTANCE for more information.

Camden County College has been granted provisional accreditation for the LPN to RN program by the NJ Board of Nursing. If the nursing program does not obtain accreditation, it will cease operation regardless of whether all of the students in the nursing program have completed their education

### STATE BOARD OF NURSING REQUIREMENTS FOR LICENSURE

Nursing Applicants are advised that State Boards of Nursing regulate licensure for Nurses. Requirements established by the Board of Nursing in the state where the person is seeking licensure must be met before the state will issue a license to practice. All applicants must pass NCLEX to be considered for licensure.

The New Jersey Board of Nursing Statute N.J.S.A. 45:11-26 states that an applicant for a license to practice professional nursing shall submit to the board evidence in such form as the board may prescribe that said applicant: (1) has attained his or her eighteenth birthday; (2) is of good moral character, is not a habitual user of drugs and has never been convicted or has not pleaded nolo contendere, non vult contendere or non vult to an indictment, information or complaint alleging a violation of any Federal or State law relating to narcotic drugs; (3) holds a diploma from an accredited 4-year high school or the equivalent thereof as determined by the New Jersey State Department of Education; (4) has completed a course of professional nursing study in an accredited school of professional nursing as defined by the board and holds a diploma therefrom.

### CAMDEN COUNTY COLLEGE NURSING LPN TO RN PROGRAM STANDARDS

#### All applicants must:

- Be at least 18 years of age.
- Must have LPN license. Note When you apply for our LPN to RN program you can be completing a PN program (as long as it will be completed by the start of the LPN to RN program). If you get admitted, you must pass the NCLEX by the 2nd week in December to continue in the LPN to RN program.
- Be at college-level Math and English following the placement requirements and/or exemptions of the Testing Center on www.camdencc.edu/testing by the start of the program.
- Provide proof of high school graduation or GED.
- Provide college transcripts from all colleges attended. Search "Awarding of Transfer Credit" on the CCC website to see CCC Admissions Department policy. All transcripts must be official except your CCC transcript.
- TEAS test minimum score of 50% is required in both reading and math, and a total score of 58.7% for admission. Results must be less than 2 years old, at the time of application, with at least 30 days in between attempts, and a maximum of 4 attempts in a calendar year. Only in-person TEAS Exam taken at an institution or testing center accepted. TEAS Remote Exams (At-Home) will NOT be accepted.
- Maintain a grade of C or better and no less than 75% in all nursing courses.
- Maintain a grade of C or better in all General Education courses in the nursing curriculum.
- A&P I and A&P II will need to be repeated if taken more than 5 years at the time of acceptance.
- Provide proof of CPR certification American Heart Association Basic Life Support for Health Care Professionals.
- The above requirements are minimum and do not guarantee acceptance into the nursing program. Applicants must meet the nursing department's criteria
  to receive provisional acceptance. The deadline for completed applications is February 1, 2024.
- Complete FAFSA if interested in financial aid (optional, but recommended).

### HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Students who are accepted into the nursing program will be required to complete a provided health history form. The form consists of medical clearance from a licensed health care provider. The clearance will attest that the provider is stating that the student may participate in all clinical activities **without restriction.** Activities include but are not limited to:

- Satisfactory cognitive and emotional functioning to ensure patient safety and exercise independent judgment and discretion in performing assigned responsibilities.
- Ability to stand for long periods of time and safely move immobile patients.
- Ability to bend, stoop and lift to deliver safe patient care.
- Sufficient bilateral finger movement to manipulate medical equipment.
- Ability to communicate effectively in a timely manner related to speaking, writing and reading.
- Sufficient hearing to communicate with patients, the healthcare team and to monitor medical equipment pertaining to patient care.
- Sufficient eyesight to observe patients in low lighting, read medical records, perform computer tasks and manipulate medical equipment.

### NURSING PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Nursing program at Camden County College provides the education that leads to an associate degree in nursing and eligibility to sit for the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nursing (NCLEX-RN). The curriculum provides students with the knowledge, technical skills, interpersonal skills and values that qualify graduates for a career in professional nursing. Content includes courses in science, social science, humanities, nursing theory, lab skills training and clinical experiences in a variety of healthcare settings. General education credits earned in this program will transfer as per existing intercollegiate agreements.

The New Jersey Board of Nursing defines, "The practice of nursing as a registered professional nurse as diagnosing and treating human responses to actual or potential physical and emotional health problems, through such services as casefinding, health teaching, health counseling, and provision of care supportive to or restorative of life and well-being, and executing medical regimens as prescribed by a licensed or otherwise legally authorized physician or dentist."

### LPN TO RN NURSING PROGRAM APPLICATION CHECKLIST INSTRUCTIONS

Please note that if you have a different name than what is on these documents, you will need to provide proof of your name change unless you already did that with Camden County College Records & Registration.

Please read and follow the instructions on this document thoroughly. This is an explanation of some of the steps and documents on the checklist. All required documents must be received by 11:59 p.m. on February 1, 2024 or the application may not be considered for admission. Do not submit this document but please submit the completed checklist (separate document) along with the other required documents.

#### **DOCUMENT SUBMISSION OPTIONS:**

**Paper Documents:** Please make sure that your full name, student ID number, and program name are on your documents. If submitting paper copies of high school or college transcripts, they must be original documents in original sealed envelopes to be considered official. Official transcripts, Letters from Employers, Letters from Former Nursing Schools, and TEAS scores may be mailed directly from the institution or hand delivered by you (in sealed envelope).

#### 2. HAND DELIVERY:

When ordering on the ATI website, select Camden County College RN and the official score report will be emailed to Nursing.

#### **Digital Submission:**

#### ELECTRONIC OFFICIAL COLLEGE TRANSCRIPTS AND TEAS SCORES:

Electronic official high school and college transcripts, official TEAS score reports, letters from employers, and letters from former nursing schools may be sent directly from the institution to nursing@camdencc.edu.

#### (Note: Admission and program requirements are subject to change):

Applicants seeking admission into the LPN to RN Nursing program must complete the following steps prior to applying to the nursing program. See above for document submission options.

- 1. Complete the Camden County College online application on the website www.camdencc.edu. Note that there are 2 parts and you must click to submit the application. There is no cost to apply. Please remember to select a program when completing your application. *You will be put into PRN.AS curriculum until you get accepted to the LPN to RN program.* If you need assistance, you may contact Admissions by calling 856-227-7200 ext 4565 or emailing admissionsoffice@ camdencc.edu. If you haven't taken classes in 5 years or more, or have graduated from CCC, please reapply.
- 2. Submit official transcripts from other colleges to CCC Admissions and submit official high school transcripts or GED to Camden County College Nursing Department. See Document Submission Options above.
- 3. Once the CCC application is received, within 24 48 hours (excluding weekends and holidays) the college emails you with your CCC Student ID Number, which you need to access your CCC Student Email and the My CCC Portal. Be sure to log into your CCC student email and the MyCCC portal as soon as possible. Emails from the Nursing Department will be sent to your student email address, not your personal email address. Therefore, you need to check your student email often. Please contact the Help Desk at helpdesk-ccc@camdencc.edu should you need assistance with access. They can also be reached at 856-374-4900. If you do not receive the email within a few days, you may contact Admissions by calling 856-227-7200 ext 4565 or emailing admissionsoffice@camdencc.edu.
- 4. Complete Camden County College's placement testing requirement or submit documents for exemption. We offer in-person or virtual College Placement Testing. For an appointment, please visit our Testing Center webpage, www.camdencc.edu/testing, and complete your request. Access to your CCC student email account is required to complete your request for a testing appointment. Test exemptions and general test preparation can also be found on the webpage. Please contact the Testing Center at 856-227-7200 x4710 or by email at testing@camdencc.edu for assistance.

-If you take the placement test and test into Developmental Education courses (not college-level English and Math), you must successfully complete them before starting the nursing program. - 5. Prepare for payment. Complete FAFSA to see possible options. Our FAFSA School Code is 006865. Follow-up with a Financial Aid staff member to keep informed of the status for financial aid and to check if any other information is needed. If financial aid monies only partially cover educational costs, enrollment in a payment plan is also available. Questions related to Financial Aid can be emailed to financialaid@camdencc.edu. If you tested into a pre-college course, you may be eligible for more financial and academic support through the Educational Opportunity Fund (EOF). Please contact our EOF Department for details. - 6. Take the TEAS. For the LPN to RN program, a minimum overall TEAS score of 58.7% with a minimum score of 50% in both Reading and Math is required. Results must be less than 2 years old with at least 30 days between attempts and maximum of 4 attempts in a year. Only in-person TEAS Exam taken at an institution or testing center accepted. TEAS Remote Exams (At-Home) will NOT be accepted. All results must be submitted officially. For more information about the TEAS and scheduling please visit www.atitesting.com.
  - a) Upon registration on the ATI TEAS website, the current ATI testing fee will be charged to take the TEAS.
  - b) If you take the TEAS at CCC you will be given an official transcript in a sealed envelope with no transcript fee. Please include it in your application packet.
  - c) If you take the TEAS at another location, go to the ATI testing website and request an "Official Transcript" to be sent to Camden County College Nursing (see submission options). ATI will charge a transcript fee.

### PHASE I: PRE-ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS (continued)

#### 7. FOR STUDENTS WHO COMPLETED HIGH SCHOOL OUTSIDE OF THE USA – BOTH a) and b) below are required

- a) High school transcripts must be evaluated by a NACES recognized evaluator https://www.naces.org/members **OR** proof of GED submitted. If you are a NJ resident and have at least 30 college credits, you may be eligible to receive a state-issued high school diploma and diploma verification letter. Visit https://www.nj.gov/education/adulted/pathways/tccp/.
- b) Must complete the TOEFL iBT (Test of English as a Foreign Language-internet based test) with a minimum required score of 75 total and at least 17 in each section **OR** If you have earned a grade of A or B in both English Composition I and English Composition II from a U.S. accredited college (not a foreign affiliate), then the TOEFL may be waived. If the TOEFL is taken, an official score report must be sent to the Nursing Department, directly from ETS, during the application period.

#### 8. FOR STUDENTS WHO COMPLETED COLLEGE COURSES OUTSIDE OF THE USA

### PHASE II: CONDITIONAL ACCEPTANCE

All provisional applicants who are offered and accept a seat must:

- At your own expense, complete a physical exam, with proof of required immunizations or titers that show immunity, including proof of up-to-date COVID-19 vaccination.
- At your own expense, provide proof of student liability insurance (approx \$50).
- Provide proof of health insurance.
- Provide proof of CPR certification –
   American Heart Association Basic Life Support.

- Within two weeks of program acceptance, at your own expense provide a clear urine drug screen and clear criminal background (approx. \$130).
- At your own expense get a respirator fit test (approx \$100).
- At your own expense, purchase uniforms and name tags.
- At your own expense, purchase required textbooks and a tote bag with lab supplies (approx \$400).
- At your own expense, obtain a laptop computer.
- Attend a mandatory program orientation.
