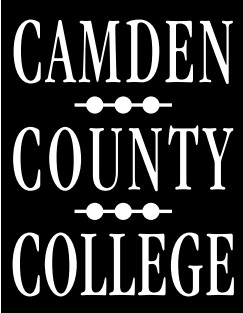

Applicants to the program must fulfill all listed admission criteria. Camden County College Nursing admission is highly competitive. Applicants with the highest scores on the Camden County College nursing program admissions assessment form rubric will be admitted to the program. The Admissions rubric is based on a combination of TEAS tests scores and course grades. Please note that meeting all of the admission criteria does not guarantee acceptance into the program.

Admission requirements for the LPN to RN program are subject to change each year. All applicants who apply to the nursing program are required to meet all of the requirements of the application period for which they apply, including those who have previously applied to, or who are currently enrolled at Camden County College. Students will be notified via their Camden County College student email within three weeks of the admission deadline regarding admission status into the Camden County program. Students must confirm acceptance into the LPN to RN program immediately upon receipt of the acceptance letter via Camden County College student email. Students will also be notified of a mandatory orientation date. Students who do not accept their seat within the time frame or do not attend the mandatory orientation risk losing their seat in the program.

Applicants may contact nursing@camdencc.edu for assistance and answers to general questions about the process described in this admission booklet. Information in this booklet reflects policies and procedures, which must be followed to be considered for admission into the 2023-2024 nursing program.

STATE BOARD OF NURSING REQUIREMENTS FOR LICENSURE

Nursing Applicants are advised that State Boards of Nursing regulate licensure for Nurses. Requirements established by the Board of Nursing in the state where the person is seeking licensure must be met before the state will issue a license to practice. All applicants must pass NCLEX to be considered for licensure.

The New Jersey Board of Nursing Statute N.J.S.A. 45:11-26 states that an applicant for a license to practice professional nursing shall submit to the board evidence in such form as the board may prescribe that said applicant: (1) has attained his or her eighteenth birthday; (2) is of good moral character, is not a habitual user of drugs and has never been convicted or has not pleaded nolo contendere, non vult contendere or non vult to an indictment, information or complaint alleging a violation of any Federal or State law relating to narcotic drugs; (3) holds a diploma from an accredited 4-year high school or the equivalent thereof as determined by the New Jersey State Department of Education; (4) has completed a course of professional nursing study in an accredited school of professional nursing as defined by the board and holds a diploma therefrom.

CAMDEN COUNTY COLLEGE NURSING LPN TO RN PROGRAM STANDARDS

All applicants must:

- Be at least 18 years of age.
- Be at college-level Math and English following the placement requirements and/or exemptions of the Testing Center on www.camdencc.edu/testing by the start of the program.
- Provide proof of high school graduation or GED.
- Provide college transcripts from all colleges attended
- **A minimum score of 50%** is required in both reading and math, and a **total score of 58.7%** for admission. Results must be less than 2 years old, at the time of application, with at least 30 days in between attempts, and a maximum of 4 attempts in a calendar year.
- Maintain a grade of C or better and no less than 75% in all nursing courses.
- Maintain a grade of C or better in all courses in the nursing curriculum.
- Provide proof of CPR certification - American Heart Association Basic Life Support for Health Care Professionals.
- The above requirements are minimum and do not guarantee acceptance into the nursing program. Applicants must meet the nursing department's criteria to receive provisional acceptance. The deadline for completed applications is **March 1, 2023**.
- Complete FAFSA if interested in financial aid (optional)

CAMDEN COUNTY COLLEGE NURSING LPN TO RN PROGRAM STANDARDS

All provisional applicants who are offered and accept a seat must:

- At your own expense, complete a physical exam, with proof of required immunizations or titers that show immunity, including COVID-19 vaccinations initial and booster doses.
- At your own expense, provide proof of student liability insurance (approx \$50).
- Provide proof of health insurance.
- Provide proof of CPR certification - American Heart Association Basic Life Support.
- Within two weeks of program acceptance, at your own expense provide a clear urine drug screen and clear criminal background (approx. \$130).
- At your own expense get a respirator fit test (approx \$100).
- At your own expense, purchase uniforms and name tags.
- At your own expense, purchase required textbooks and a tote bag with lab supplies (approx \$400).
- At your own expense, obtain a laptop computer.
- Attend a mandatory program orientation.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Students who are accepted into the nursing program will be required to complete a health history form. The form consists of medical clearance from a licensed health care provider. The clearance will attest that the provider is stating that the student may participate in all clinical activities **without restriction**. Activities include but are not limited to:

- Satisfactory cognitive and emotional functioning to ensure patient safety and exercise independent judgment and discretion in performing assigned responsibilities.
- Ability to stand for long periods of time and safely move immobile patients.
- Ability to bend, stoop and lift to deliver safe patient care.
- Sufficient bilateral finger movement to manipulate medical equipment.
- Ability to communicate effectively in a timely manner related to speaking, writing and reading.
- Sufficient hearing to communicate with patients, the healthcare team and to monitor medical equipment pertaining to patient care.
- Sufficient eyesight to observe patients in low lighting, read medical records, perform computer tasks and manipulate medical equipment.

NURSING PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Nursing program at Camden County College provides the education that leads to an associate degree in nursing and eligibility to sit for the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nursing (NCLEX-RN). The curriculum provides students with the knowledge, technical skills, interpersonal skills and values that qualify graduates for a career in professional nursing. Content includes courses in science, social science, humanities, nursing theory, lab skills training and clinical experiences in a variety of healthcare settings. General education credits earned in this program will transfer as per existing intercollegiate agreements.

LPN TO RN NURSING PROGRAM APPLICATION CHECKLIST INSTRUCTIONS

Please read and follow the instructions on this document thoroughly. This is an explanation of some of the steps and documents on the checklist. All required documents must be received by 4PM on March 1, 2023 or the application may not be considered for admission. Do not submit this document but please submit the completed checklist (separate document).

DOCUMENT SUBMISSION OPTIONS:

Paper Documents: Please make sure that your full name, student ID number, and program name are on your documents. Submit your documents in a large envelope. If submitting paper copies of college transcripts, they must be original documents in original sealed envelopes to be considered official. Official transcripts and TEAS scores may be mailed directly from the institution or hand delivered by you.

Excluding college transcripts and TEAS scores, when completing the online application on our webpage you may upload supporting documents.

2. ELECTRONIC OFFICIAL COLLEGE TRANSCRIPTS AND TEAS SCORES:

These may be sent directly from the institution to nursing@camdenc.edu. Please note that if you have a different name than what is on these documents, you will need to provide proof of your name change unless you already did that with Camden County College Records & Registration.

PHASE I: PRE-ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

(Note: Admission and program requirements are subject to change):

Applicants seeking admission into the LPN to RN Nursing program must complete the following steps prior to applying to the nursing program. See above for document submission options.

1. Complete the Camden County College online application on the website www.camdenc.edu. Note that there are 2 parts and you must click to submit the application. There is no cost to apply. Please remember to select a program when completing your application. You will be put into PRN.AS curriculum until you get accepted to the LPN to RN program. If you need assistance, you may contact Admissions by calling 856-227-7200 ext 4565 or emailing admissionoffice@camdenc.edu.
2. Submit official transcripts from other colleges and submit proof of high school graduation or GED.
3. Once the CCC application is received, within 24 - 48 hours (excluding weekends and holidays) the college emails you with your CCC Student ID Number, which you need to access your CCC Student Email and the My CCC Portal. Be sure to log into your CCC student email and the MyCCC portal as soon as possible. Emails from the Nursing Department will be sent to your student email address, not your personal email address. Therefore, you need to check your student email often. Please contact the Help Desk at helpdesk-ccc@camdenc.edu should you need assistance with access. They can also be reached at 856-374-4900. If you do not receive the email within a few days, you may contact Admissions by calling 856-227-7200 ext 4565 or emailing admissionoffice@camdenc.edu.
4. Complete Camden County College's placement testing requirement or submit documents for exemption. We offer in-person or virtual College Placement Testing. For an appointment, please visit our Testing Center webpage, www.camdenc.edu/testing, and complete your request. Access to your CCC student email account (see Step 2) is required to complete your request for a testing appointment. Test exemptions and general test preparation can also be found on the webpage. Please contact the Testing Center at 856-227-7200 x4710 or by email at testing@camdenc.edu for assistance.
 - If you take the placement test and test into Developmental Education courses (not college-level English and Math), you must successfully complete them before admission to the nursing program. If you need further assistance with placement test results, meet with an advisor. Advisement's website is www.camdenc.edu/advisement.

5. Prepare for payment. Complete FAFSA to see possible options. Our FAFSA School Code is 006865. Follow-up with a Financial Aid staff member to keep informed of the status for financial aid and to check if any other information is needed. 6. **Take the TEAS. For the LPN to RN program, a minimum overall TEAS score of 58.7% with a minimum score of 50% in both Reading and Math is required. Results must be less than 2 years old with at least 30 days between attempts and maximum of 4 attempts in a year. All results must be submitted officially. For more information about the TEAS and scheduling please visit www.atitesting.com.**
- a) Upon registration on the ATI TEAS website, the current ATI testing fee will be charged to take the TEAS.
 - b) If you take the TEAS at CCC you will be given an official transcript in a sealed envelope. Please include it in your application packet.
 - c) If you take the TEAS online or at another location, go to the ATI testing website and request an "Official Transcript" to be sent to Camden County College Nursing (see submission options on the previous page). ATI will charge a \$27.00 transcript fee.
7. **FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS ONLY: Both of these requirements must be completed prior to being considered for admission. Contact the International Student's Office for more information.**
- a) **International students wishing to transfer credits earned in their home countries have the responsibility of having their high school and/ or college transcripts evaluated by a NACES or AACRAO - recognized evaluator of foreign credentials, and submitted to the Camden County College; Office of Admissions; PO Box 200, Blackwood, NJ 08012**
 - b) **Completion of TOEFL-ibt (Test of English as a Foreign Language-internet based test) is also a requirement. A minimum required score is 75 total and at least 17 in each section.**

*The TOWWEFL may be waived if the student has earned a grade of B or better both in English Composition101 and English Composition 102 from an U.S. accredited college (not a foreign affiliate).

- I will be at least 18 years of age prior to the completion of the program.

 - I am finishing my PN program and understand that I must have my LPN license by mid-August to continue in the LPN to RN program if accepted
- I understand that A&P I and II must be a maximum of 5 years old from acceptance date and that all required courses must have a minimum grade of C.

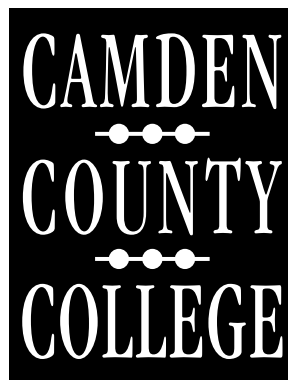
