# HOW TO APPLY TO OUR NURSING PROGRAMS



Set up your Student Email and log in to the myCCCportal College's placement testing


**Complete Camden County** requirement (or provide proof of exemption)

Please note that when you apply and indicate interest in one of the selective programs such as Our Lady of Lourdes School of Nursing, PN program, or LPN to RN program, you will be put into pre-nursing, PRN.AS, until you apply and get accepted to the selective program. You may want to schedule classes based on the curriculum of the program that you want to pursue. Advising could help you!

# CAMDEN COUNTY COLLEGE OFFERS THE **FOLLOWING NURSING PROGRAM OPTIONS**

- Practical Nursing (NUR.CT) 3 semesters (12 months)
- CCC LPN to RN (NUR.AS) 4 semesters (15 months)
- > Our Lady of Lourdes School of Nursing (NOL.AS) 6 semesters (24 months) (4 semesters/15 months after prerequisites are completed)
- > Associate in Science Pre-Nursing Option (PRN.AS) 2 years of General Education courses - then transfer to a BSN nursing program

\*These are approximations based on full-time status and completing the curriculum as prescribed.

# SELECTIVE ADMISSION

- > Programs are competitive

- colleges.

### NOTE

You must apply to both Camden County College AND the nursing program in which you are interested, when the application is available.

> Applicants must meet certain criteria to be eligible for program admission

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Need American Heart Association CPR Basic Life Support (BLS) -
CCC does offer this as HPE-181
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> All programs require a Criminal History and Background Check and urine drug screen

> Letter from the Dean's office of previously attended nursing program that was not completed stating applicant is no longer in attendance for reasons other than clinical or professional misconduct (required if applicable)

Refer to individual programs for specific admission requirements

> You may submit official transcripts from another accredited college or foreign transcript evaluation service (NACES members only) to CCC Admissions to transfer courses and possibly satisfy General Education course requirements. Nursing courses will not transfer between

- Courses taken online ARE acceptable for our nursing programs as long as they transfer to CCC for NUR.CT, NUR.AS, and NOL.AS

> OLOLSON accepts only WES foreign transcript service evaluations

> CCC doesn't accept credits from proprietary institutions or certain schools like Jersey College



# PRACTICAL NURSING **OPTION (NUR.CT)**

(1 YEAR ACCELERATED-LPN CERTIFICATE)

### > 55% minimum total TEAS score required with minimum of 50% in Math and 50% in Reading.

- > No minimum GPA
- nursing courses.
- level A&P courses.

- Results no more than 2 years old at the time of application. At least 30 days between attempts. Maximum of 4 attempts per calendar year. In-person TEAS test only (Remote test not accepted). Big chunk of Application Rubric.

- Register for TEAS - www.atitesting.com. Testing fees are on the website. No transcript fee if you take the TEAS at CCC

> Applications available on the nursing webpage on November 1st and due by February 1st. Response to student email on or before April 1st.

> While awaiting admission, you could take any of the non-nursing courses.

No prerequisite courses unless you need to take remedial (aka developmental) courses based on your placement: www.camdencc.edu/testing.

Must have a C or higher in all non-nursing courses and a 75 or higher in

> A&P I and A&P II - 5 year age limit at the time of acceptance (Spring). 100 or 200 levels accepted. Note that BIO-111, Biology is a prerequisite to 200















The PN program admits cohorts once a year and runs from the Fall semester to the following August – 12 months – it is an accelerated program. The lectures and labs are 2-3 days a week and the clinical is 1 day a week. The non-nursing courses, the General Education courses, you could schedule yourself during the day, evening, and/or online. Typically for the Daytime program nursing courses in the first semester, Lecture is one morning a week, Lab is another morning or afternoon, and Clinical is one day a week 7am-5pm. For the Evening program, typically Lecture is one night a week, Lab is one night a week, and Clinical is every other weekend both Saturday and Sunday 7am-4pm.

Currently have 40 daytime and 20 evening seats.

COST for Practical Nursing program (NUR.CT) may vary depending on the number of nonnursing courses you need for the program. If you have already taken all of the non-nursing courses, then Tuition and Fees (includes online access to ATI, which is the software and textbook used most) \$8045 (split over 3 semesters). If you need to take ALL of the nursing courses and non-nursing courses, approximately \$11,700. These estimates are subject to change and do NOT include books, lab materials, or uniforms.

# LPN TO RN **PROGRAM 15 MONTHS** ACCELERATED

- > Must be an LPN\*
- the TEAS at CCC.
- No minimum GPA
- www.camdencc.edu/testing.

### NOTE

At the time of application to the LPN to RN program, you can be completing a PN program as long as it will be completed by the start of our program. If you get admitted, you must pass the NCLEX by the 2nd week in December to continue in the LPN to RN program.

> TEAS minimum 58.7% with minimum of 50% in Math and 50% in Reading. Results no more than 2 years old at the time of application. 30 days between attempts. Maximum of 4 attempts per calendar year. In-person TEAS test only (Remote test not accepted). Big chunk of Application Rubric.

No prerequisite courses unless you need to take remedial courses based on your placement -

> A&P I and A&P II – 5 year age limit at the time of acceptance (March). 100 or 200 levels accepted. Note that BIO-111, Biology is a prerequisite to 200 level A&P courses.

> Must have a C or higher in all non-nursing course requirements and a 75 or higher in Nursing courses.

Lectures and labs held at the Joint Health Sciences Center in Camden. Clinical locations vary.

> Applications available on the nursing webpage on November 1st and due by February 1st. Response to student email on or before April 1st.

While awaiting admission, you could take any of the non-nursing classes.

# LPN TO RN **PROGRAM 15 MONTHS** ACCELERATED

> The LPN to RN program runs from the Fall semester to December of the following year – 15 months. This is an accelerated, daytime, program. We currently have 40 seats per cohort.

> The first Fall semester has only 1 nursing course – the lecture and lab are the same day. In the 2nd through 4th semesters the lectures and labs are 2-3 days a week and the clinical is 1 day a week. The schedule varies each semester. Plus, there is online work to do. The non-nursing courses, the General Education courses, you could schedule yourself during the day, evening, and/or online.

> COST for LPN to RN Nursing program (NUR.AS) may vary depending on the number of non-nursing courses you need for the program. If you have already taken all of the non-nursing courses, then Tuition and Fees (includes online access to ATI, which is the software and textbook used most) \$9300 (split over 4 semesters). If you need to take ALL of the nursing courses and non-nursing courses, approximately \$15,800. These estimates are subject to change and do NOT include books, lab materials, or uniforms.

# PN & LPN TO RN PROGRAMS

**Requirements for Students** who completed high school and/or college in a foreign country

# FOR STUDENTS WHO COMPLETED HIGH SCHOOL **OUTSIDE OF THE USA – BOTH ARE REQUIRED:**

> High school transcripts must be evaluated by a NACES recognized evaluator https://www.naces.org/members OR proof of GED submitted. If you are a NJ resident and have at least 30 college credits, you may be eligible to receive a stateissued high school diploma and diploma verification letter. Visit https://www.nj.gov/education/adulted/pathways/tccp/.

> Must complete the TOEFL iBT(Test of English as a Foreign Language-internet based test) with a minimum required score of 75 total and at least 17 in each section. OR If you have earned a grade of A or B in both English Composition I and English Composition II from a U.S. accredited college (not a foreign affiliate), then the **TOEFL** may be waived.

College transcripts must be evaluated by a company who is a member of NACES. Visit https://www.naces.org/members Send transcript evaluation to CCC Admissions.

# PN & LPN TO RN PROGRAMS

### **Mandatory Compliance** Requirements

**Failure to provide required documentation may lead to involuntary** dismissal from the nursing program.

## IF OFFERED ACCEPTANCE TO PN OR LPN TO RN PROGRAM

Students responsible to obtain, pay for, and provide documentation.

Required vaccines and Physical Exam using Student Health Record form provided.

> Health Insurance is required and must be maintained for all Nursing Program students throughout the nursing program.

> Professional Liability Insurance-Students enrolled in programs with a clinical practice component are required to purchase and maintain yearly Liability Insurance coverage

> CPR -Healthcare Provider-Students must maintain current CPR certification through the American Heart Association (AHA)-Health Care Provider throughout the program.

> All students are required to have a Laptop computer for communication, course material, exams and

> Each student must have the required textbooks and recommended lab equipment (sold at bookstore)

> Each student must have the required uniform for lectures, labs, and clinicals

> Must have clear urine drug screen and criminal background check. If you have anything in your background, try to get it expunged NOW. Search internet for Expungement events.





# PN & LPN TO RN PROGRAMS

Essential functions required of students for admission and progression

### **ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS ARE AS FOLLOWS:**

> Knowledge, skills and attitudes to function in diverse clinical settings and perform within their scope of practice;

Functional use of sensory and motor functions to permit them to carry out the activities in the areas listed;

> Ability to consistently, quickly and accurately integrate all information received by whatever sense(s) employed and the intellectual ability to learn, integrate, analyze and synthesize data;

Capability to perform in a reasonably independent manner. Clinical decision making and exercising clinical judgment are essential functions of the role of the student



- > As of 11/1/23, TEAS not required.

> Applications are accepted throughout the year (aka rolling admissions). If accepted you will be offered a seat in a future semester.

> 6-semester program (if taking courses as prescribed in the curriculum).

> Nursing courses (NOL) approximately 23k - doesn't include non-nursing, general education

> 10 Year age limit, at the time of application, for A&P I, A&P II, Chemistry, and Microbiology



# LICENSURE EXAM

### **UPON SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF EACH PROGRAM:**

CCC PN certificate NUR.CT - Eligible to take NCLEX-PN

CCC LPN to RN NUR.AS - Eligible to take NCLEX-RN

Our Lady of Lourdes SON - NOL.AS - Eligible to take NCLEX-RN

### NOTE

Liberal Arts and Science: Pre-Nursing Option PRN.AS is an associates degree curriculum with no nursing courses -NOT eligible to take NCLEX -must complete a nursing program to become a nurse.


