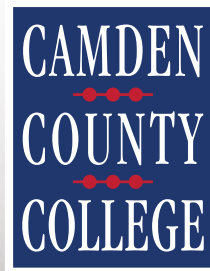


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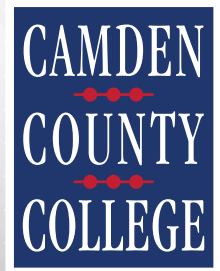

Students are encouraged to integrate into College life through various on-campus, social activities such as the Welcome Back BBQ, Spring Fling, various clubs, as well as educational lectures outside of the typical classroom.

The Garden State Pathways Program is a Post-Secondary, transitional program designed for students with intellectual/developmental disabilities. The program serves students eighteen years of age or older who are eligible for or received IDEA funding; and are interested in learning work-related skills as well as enhancing life-skills that lead to independence.

- This program is focused on providing services to students who require an alternative to a traditional college education and would benefit from a smaller, structured environment.
- Students whom prefer to remain under the IDEA entitlement through their school district until the age of 21 may enter the program after meeting all high school requirements, despite not having accepted their official diploma.
